xsign worked with contractor ISG and Associated Architects on the signage scheme at the University of Wolverhampton, School of Architecture.

Externally, we have provided cut letters, a totem sign to aid wayfinding and directional signage that helps users to navigate through building entrance points.

Internally, we have provided our patented Jigsaw system that allows for the easy changing of direction panels, should room locations change. We have also provided cut letters to provide branding to key facilities and iconography for facilities such as the toilets.





The Jigsaw system uses a secret fixing system to enable the easy changing of panels. It doesn't require a key or any special tools.

Featuring high resolution digital print on 4mm thick frosted lucite panels, the directional wayfinding signs provide excellent legibility.



Using a blackened steel colour system helps the signage to match the modern architectural theme. The signs are wall mounted for a secure fitting.

Directional signs to the outside of the building are fixed using substantial brackets and automotive grade paint has been applied to the surface for protection against the elements.



Our signage systems blend and compliment the outstanding modern architecture and our schemes are flexible to meet the client needs.

We have provided 4mm thick cut foil-faced lucite letters with a polished edge that offers wayfinding and navigation throughout the building.
